From the CEO...

Since our fall 2017 newsletter, Kijik and its subsidiaries and affiliates have experienced a great deal of activity and progress. Kijik Aviation Services (KAS) is becoming very well established in its first 8(a) contract with the Food & Drug Administration (FDA). We are hopeful we will be able to use the experience we gain under the FDA contract to convince other federal agencies of our performance capabilities and capture additional work opportunities for KAS. International Data Systems (IDS) was approved for 8(a) certification by the SBA in late 2017. IDS has a good work history and, in combination with its 8(a) certification, should be able to secure federal work within the coming months. However, IDS staff is not waiting for a federal work opportunity to come along and are now aggressively pursuing work in the private sector and with a few Alaska Native organizations.

Chuchuna Minerals Company (CMC) is now undergoing operations planning for the 2018 exploration season. A preliminary operating budget has been prepared and presented to our investor group, Quatterra Resources, Inc., and we are awaiting their input and approval. We are hopeful of a larger budget than 2017 which will correlate to more employment for Kijik shareholders and shareholder descendants. Last year, CMC contractors were able to employ over 10 shareholders in laborer and drill helper positions. Additionally, our CMC partner, Alaska Earth Sciences, Inc., has drawn from the Nondalton/Kijik labor pool for other projects.

I have been all over our Country by boat, by snow go, by Honda and by my own two feet. International Data Systems, LLC – Update

We recently concluded the first full year of operations after Kijik bought IDS and there were many successes. When 2017 began, one of the key priorities was to gain preferential status with the federal government. We accomplished that goal in October, 2017 when the Small Business Administration certified IDS into the Section 8(a) program. This is a significant competitive advantage because it allows IDS to compete for federal contracts as a minority-owned business.

There have been other accomplishments as well. IDS teamed with its sister company, Kijik Aviation Services on a large contract with the Alaska Aerospace Corporation to construct a housing facility at the Kodiak Launch Facility. IDS will design and manage the installation of the IT, security and communications network for the new facility.

IDS continues to expand its business in Anchorage and Alaska as well as looking for opportunities to contract with the federal government.

Kijik Aviation Services, LLC – Update

KAS continues to perform well on the FDA contract to deliver Tribal Outreach and Communications services to Indian Country across the United States. The contract has been slow to develop, primarily due to federal budget constraints. We expect this to change in the next few months now that Congress and the White House have finalized the FY2018 Budget.

In addition, KAS was awarded a security and communication subcontract for construction of a Support Housing facility on the Alaska Aerospace Launch complex on Kodiak Island. KAS will perform overall program management and perform the fencing construction. This project is important for two reasons, first of course because of the positive financial impact for Kijik; second, the project is funded through the federal Missile Defense Agency so KAS gains visibility with both the State of Alaska and the US Department of Defense.

KAS continues to expand its business by looking for opportunities to contract with the federal government, both civilian and defense-related agencies.

In addition to the above, shareholder descendent Calvin Trefon was awarded a \$1600 vocational training scholarship to attend the Alaska Technical Center in Kotzebue. Calvin obtained his certification, as a driller's helper, and hopes to again be employed by the Groundhog exploration program, in 2018, working with the drilling crew.

The Chuchuna Scholarship Fund (CSF) was established in April 2017 under a mineral exploration agreement between Chuchuna Minerals Company and Six-Mile Mining Company (a.k.a. Quaterra Resources, Incorporated). Chuchuna Mineral Company is jointly owned by Kijik Corporation and Alaska Earth Sciences, Incorporated. The scholarship fund is administered by the Kijik Education Committee for the benefit of Kijik shareholders and their descendants. The scholarship fund mission is to develop shareholder opportunities that allow for personal growth and development. The CSF exemplifies Chuchuna's commitment to Kijik shareholders and responsible and environmentally sound mineral development.

Job Opening – Administrative Assistant (IDS)

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Answer/Forward telephones and take messages as needed.
2. Meet and greet clients and visitors.
3. Administer/Maintain – PearsonVue tests through computer based programs.
4. Create and modify documents using Microsoft Office.
5. Perform general clerical duties to include but not limited to: photocopying, faxing, mailing, and filing.
6. Maintain hard copy and electronic filing system.
7. Coordinate and maintain records as directed.
8. Setup and coordinate meetings and conferences primarily with customer groups.
9. Maintain and distribute daily mail, along with check Post Office Box regularly.
10. Sign for and distribute UPS/Fed Ex/Airborne packages.
11. Collect and maintain PC inventory.
12. Research, price, and purchase office supplies.
13. Provide support in assigned project based work.


