From the CEO...

On May 5th, Kijik held its annual shareholder meeting, in Anchorage, and despite the new requirements affecting our proxy solicitation process the meeting proceeded as scheduled. In late March, Kijik's shareholder base grew to 500 thereby making Kijik subject to the requirements of the Alaska Securities Act. All proxy solicitation documents are now required to be filed with the State Division of Banking & Securities. The annual report and proxy statement provided more information than prior year's annual meeting packets and we hope you found the new information helpful.

As we have explained previously, the annual meeting location alternates between Anchorage and Nondalton so this year we will be hosting a shareholder information meeting, in Nondalton, on June 2nd at the community building beginning at 10:00 AM. The same management report provided at the Anchorage annual meeting will be given at the Nondalton information meeting. This gives the Nondalton shareholders the benefit of receiving the same report and allows them the opportunity to ask their own questions of management and the board.

In addition to presenting the annual meeting report, there will be a special report provided by Michelle Johnson of Chuchuna Minerals Company regarding the status of Groundhog exploration activities. The 2018 exploration plan is nearing completion and Michele will be able to provide a detailed description of the planned operations. Michelle will also be able to respond to any questions regarding employment opportunities and planned hiring dates for the 2018 season.

You will note in this issue of the Homelander there is a special notice reminding all shareholders and shareholder descendants that the deadline for submitting an application to the Kijik Education Committee for consideration under Chuchuna Scholarship Fund (CSF) is May 31st. Last year over \$18,000 was granted to eligible applicants under the CSF for vocational training and college education. May 31st is also the deadline for scholarship

funding consideration under the Qizhjuh Heritage Institute (QHI). QHI is another important source of scholarship funding and last year was able to provide more than \$6,000 of funding to eligible applicants. If you are a shareholder or shareholder descendent either planning to or actively engaged in a college or vocational training program that is eligible for funding, you are encourage to apply and take advantage of these important sources of funding.

If you are in Nondalton, we look forward to seeing you at the information meeting on June 2nd and we wish you all a happy and safe summer.

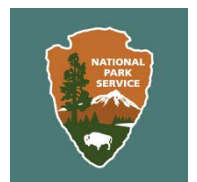

Kijik Aviation Services, LLC - Report

Kijik Aviation continues to perform on the Tribal Outreach / Communications contract for the US Health and Human Services Food and Drug Administration. Work under the contract was slow over the winter of 2018 due to uncertainty over budget negotiations between US Congress and the White House. A budget bill was passed in March 2018 and KAS is beginning to see more work requested from the FDA. Our second year on the contract begins at the end of June, 2018. KAS also to perform work on its subcontract at the Alaska Aerospace Corporation Pacific Spaceport Complex in Kodiak which involves installing fencing, security measures and IT communications systems. We began working on this project in February, 2018, with most of the work to be completed by the end of May, 2018.

Kijik Technical Services, LLC - Report

KTS is a subsidiary of Kijik. KTS signed its initial contract to perform business planning services with Golovin Native Corporation in regard to a resource development project near Golovin. Our work begins in April and will continue through July, with possible work through the end of 2018. This contract may lead to a long-term project management contract for KTS for several years.

International Data Systems, LLC - Report

IDS continues to perform usual IT operations serving existing clients in Anchorage and Alaska. IDS was given the subcontract from KAS to implement the IT communications work related to the Kodiak Launch project. The major components of the IT installation are taking place in early May. IDS will provide ongoing IT maintenance through the launch schedule during the summer of 2018.

Both IDS and KAS continue marketing their services to Federal agencies, especially those associated with Health and Human Services (HHS) and related organizations such as National Institute of Health, Center for Disease Control and Food and Drug Administration. Both companies are talking to other federal agencies including Department of Defense in Washington DC looking for additional contracts to take advantage of the subsidiary's 8a certification status.
